MINUTES OF THE YAI ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 09 DEC 14

1. The YAI 46th Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held at 1630 h on 09 Dec 2014 at Varunika, Nausena Bagh, New Delhi. The following Council Members were present:-

2. <u>Member Clubs and Life Associate Members Present at the Meeting</u>. The list of members with voting rights present during the AGM is placed at **Annexure I**. List of members with no voting rights present during the meeting is placed at **Annexure II**. List of members who abstained from the meeting is placed at **Annexure III**. List of Life Associate Members present during the meeting is placed at **Annexure IV**.

<u>Item No. I - President's Opening Address</u>

- 3. At the outset, the President welcomed all Members of the house to the 46th Annual General Meeting of the YAI. He stated that it was his privilege to preside over the meeting after being elected as YAI President and thanked all present for their support.
- 4. The President thereafter stated that being a maritime nation, India had tremendous potential to excel in yachting but regretfully the country had not been able to produce the desirable number of yachtspersons who excelled in this sport at national

and international events. He, however, expressed the hope that with the concerted effort of all present in the audience, competitive performance in yachting could be given the necessary impetus and improved significantly.

- 5. The President thereafter stated that there were three main areas which needed urgent attention to improve sailing in the country. The President elaborated that the first aspect that needed attention was to identify talent especially in our coastal areas and mentioned that some of the clubs were doing a marvelous job in this regard both on West and East coast. In order to ensure this, he added, there was an urgent need to popularise yachting at the grass roots level, and identify, support and mentor talented school children with an inclination and aptitude for the sport. He sought the support from like-minded people in such talent hunt. The President stated that some of the sources to tap the talent were NCC and Sea Cadet Corps. He further brought out that the Navy had taken certain measures in its training establishments to improve the sailing skills of naval personnel.
- 6. The President stated that the second aspect that needed impetus was building of infrastructure at sailing clubs in order to support and promote the sport. This, he added, also needed the close involvement and active participation of all Member Clubs.
- 7. The President stated that the third and most important aspect was to bring competitiveness in the sport with the aim to achieve podium finishes in international events. The President thereafter highlighted the need for all concerned to work collectively with Members clubs, yachtspersons, coaches and the other yachting functionaries to nurture and support talented yachtspersons with the objective of qualifying for Olympic Games 2016 and winning medals at Asian Games 2018 and Olympic Games 2020. He also brought out that despite best efforts, India could achieve only one podium finish at Asian Games 2014, which was an important, but modest achievement.
- 8. The President apprised all members that in order to elevate the level of yachting accomplishments, the YAI would soon bring out a Vision Document that would guide and synergise all efforts to improve and promote the sport in the country.
- 9. The President thereafter requested the Honorary Secretary General to commence the proceedings.

<u>Item No. II - To approve and confirm the minutes of the Annual General Meeting of 17 Oct 2013.</u>

10. The HSG brought out that the next item on the agenda was to confirm the minutes of the General Body meeting held on 17 Oct 2013, the minutes of which were issued on 19 Nov 2013. He also informed the house that the copy of the minutes of the AGM held on 17 Oct 13 was placed on YAI Website. No comments or observations were received from any Member Club on recording of the minutes. The HSG thereafter sought to confirm the minutes from the General Body.

11. The representative of Chennai Sailing Academy proposed passing of the minutes. This was seconded by the representative of INWTC (Vizag).

<u>Item No. III - To Receive the Report of Honorary Secretary General for the period 18 Oct 2013 - 08 Dec 2014.</u>

- 12. The HSG presented his report for the period 18 Oct 2013 09 Dec 2014. A copy of the report is placed at **Annexure V**. The various issues covered by the HSG in his report were as follows:-
 - (a) <u>Important Council Decisions</u>. The HSG apprised the house on important Council decisions taken in the Council meetings held between 18 Oct 13 till 09 Dec 14 and the same are enumerated below:-
 - (i) Event Bidding System: Extension of Cut off Date. The HSG apprised the house that the Council had approved event bidding system during its meeting held on 09 Sep 13. However due to certain issues the event bidding cut off date was extended to end Mar 14 for the calendar year 2014. He also appraised the house that promulgation of the Annual Sailing Calendar was a mandatory requirement as per Sports Code 2011 and needed to be completed by mid Nov each year for the ensuing calendar year.
 - (ii) <u>New Affiliation</u> The HSG informed the house that the Council had approved the provisional affiliation of 'Palm Grove Sailing Club' a Chennai based club run and managed by Indian Army.
 - (iii) Amendments to YAI General Rules and Formulation of Bye laws The HSG apprised the house that the Council had approved undertaking the amendments to the General Rules and formulation of By Laws so that the YAI General Rules were compliant to the National Sports Code 2011. He further informed the house that the same would be discussed as a separate agenda point in this AGM.
 - (iv) Voting Rights to Goa Yachting Association (GYA) The HSG informed the General Body that during the last AGM, the GYA had raised an issue of restoring their voting rights. The President had taken a decision that the same would be examined de novo by the Council. The issue was discussed by the Council and it was decided that Status Quo be maintained on the issue.
 - (v) <u>Multi Classes Regatta as National Championship for Seniors & Youth Classes</u>. The HSG apprised the house that the Council had decided that henceforth the YAI would organise one Multi Class Regatta which would be designated as National Championship for the classes covered under them. The National Championships in Senior and Youth will be held separately and would be rotated on West Coast and East Coast

every year. He also informed the house that the Class Associations were at liberty to organise yachting events as deemed fit in consultation with Member Sailing Clubs, however, YAI approval would be mandatory for such events and these events would not be termed as National Championships.

- (vi) Formation of Two Tier National Squad System

 The HSG apprised the General Body that the Council had decided to form National Squads for ensuring continuity of training and performance based appraisal. The National Squad would now comprise of A and B squads, which essentially implies "Elite" and "Development" squads respectively. The elite squad would be selected based on the criteria laid down by the Selection Committee and Development squad would comprise of those sailors who demonstrate sufficient skills to be groomed further as elite sailors. Chairman SPDC and Chief National Coach (CNC) would recommend the names of sailors to be included in the development squad to the Selection Committee.
- (vii) Extension of Contract of Chief National Coach. The HSG informed the house that the Council had approved the extension of Contract of Mr Peter David Conway for a period of two years ie upto 31 Dec 2016. He further stated that this was done to ensure continuity in training and coaching.
- (viii) Formulation of Long Term Plan of Four Years upto Asian Games 2018

 The HSG apprised the General Body that it was for the first time in the history of Asian Games that the classes of boats to be sailed in the next Asian Games had been announced four years in advance and it was most appropriate that the YAI draw and formulate long term plan upto Asian Games 2018. He stated that the plan was being formulated and would be placed on YAI website shortly.
- (ix) Memorandum of Understanding between YAI and TNSA. The HSG apprised the General Body that the Tamil Nadu Sailing Association (TNSA) had entered into a MoU with Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu (SDAT) for setting up of a Centre of Excellence at Chennai. The TNSA had requested YAI to consider being a partner in the development so that the facilities could be shared with YAI. The Council had agreed in principle to execute the MoU with TNSA. The modalities of MoU were being worked out.
- (b) <u>National Championships</u>. The HSG enumerated the National events conducted during the period under review.

- (c) Overseas Training and Competition The HSG apprised the house on participation in overseas events by the yachtspersons during the period under review. He further informed the house that an approximate amount of Rs.300 lakhs out of the total allotted amount of Rs. 324 lakhs was spent on preparing the teams for International events. He also brought out that the performance of the juniors and youth was commendable in the overseas participation, however there was a need to improve our performance in the Olympic classes. The HSG also informed the house that the attendance in the coaching camps for some classes was below desired level. He further informed the house that in future such absence from coaching camps would be viewed seriously and those found absent from the coaching camps would not be allowed to participate in the overseas events.
- (d) Report on Asian Games 2014. The HSG apprised the members about the results of the Indian Yachting team who had participated in the Asian Games 2014.
- (e) <u>ASAF Meetings</u>. The HSG apprised the General Body that HSG along with HJSG attended the ASAF meeting held at Incheon, South Korea on 22 Sep 2014. He also elaborated on various decisions taken during the ASAF meetings including the classes of boats that were decided to be sailed during the Asian Games 2018.

Item No. IV. To receive, consider and adopt the Profit and Loss Account for the financial year ended on 31 March 2014 and the Balance Sheet as on that date and the report of Auditors' thereon.

- 13. The Treasurer gave a presentation to the General Body on the state of accounts of YAI. A copy of the presentation is placed at **Annexure VI**. The Treasurer informed the house that the audit of accounts for the FY 2012-13 had been approved by the General Body during the AGM held on 17 Oct 2013. He stated that the copies of the accounts had been submitted to the AGCR, the statutory Government Authority for auditing all central revenue accounts. He further stated that IT returns up to FY 2012-13 had been filed and there were no audit objections raised by the AGCR so far.
- 14. The Profit and Loss A/c for the FY 2013-14 and the Balance Sheet as on that date including the Auditor's report thereon had been approved by the YAI Council during its meeting held on 13 Oct 2014. The Treasurer thereafter sought approval of the General Body for adoption of the Profit and Loss A/c for the FY 2013-14 and the Balance Sheet as on that date including the Auditor's report thereon.
- 15. Representative of Mumbai Yacht Club proposed passing of accounts for the FY 2013-14 and the representative of National Optimist Association seconded the motion.

Item No. V - To consider and if thought fit to pass with or without modification(s), the ordinary resolution appointing M/s Sanjay Pathak & Associates, Chartered Accountants as Auditors of the Association.

16. The Treasurer stated that M/s Sanjay Pathak & Associates were appointed as statutory auditors during the last AGM, and their performance had been satisfactory. It was, therefore, recommended that the auditors be retained for FY 2014-15. He also informed the house that the MYAS has laid down a fresh guide line which stipulated that the auditors appointed by the NSFs were to be CAG empaneled and that M/s Sanjay Pathak & Associates were CAG empaneled and meets the criteria for appointment of auditors. The Treasurer thereafter sought approval of the house for appointment of the auditors by quoting:-

"RESOLVED THAT subject to the provisions of sub section (2) of section 16 and other applicable provisions, if any, of the West Bengal Societies Registration Act 1961, M/s. Sanjay Pathak & Associates, Chartered Accountants, are hereby appointed as Auditors of the Association to hold office from the conclusion of this General Body Meeting upto the conclusion of the next General Body Meeting, to audit the accounts of the Association for the financial year 2014-15 at a remuneration to be fixed by the General Body on the recommendation of the Council."

17. The representative of 29er Class Association proposed the appointment of M/s Sanjay Pathak & Associates as statutory auditors of the YAI. This was seconded by the representative of National Sailing School, Bhopal.

<u>Item No. VI - Proposal for Registration of the Yachting Association of India at New Delhi.</u>

- 18. The HSG apprised the General Body that the YAI was registered under Societies Registration Act XXVI of 1961 on 22 December 1964 at Calcutta, West Bengal. The YAI was required to submit various documents, reports and change of office bearers to the Registrar within stipulated time in person. It was noted that in order to submit these details in a time bound manner as required by the Law, the YAI officials had to make a number of visits to the Registrar's Office at Kolkata. These entail a large amount of financial implications as well as result in administrative difficulties. He stated that the issue had been discussed by the YAI Council and the Council had approved initiation of suitable actions for registration of YAI at New Delhi.
- 19. The HSG thereafter sought the approval of the General Body to initiate suitable actions for registration of the YAI at New Delhi. Cmde Atul Anand, Life Associate Member stated that this was a long overdue and as such benefit the YAI in ensuring than sparency in its affairs.
- 20. Representative of INWTC Mandovi (Goa), proposed registration of the YAI at New Delhi. The proposal was seconded by the representative of Navi Mumbai Yacht Club.

Item No. VII – Amendments to YAI General Rules

- 21. The HSG brought out that the National Sports Development Code (NSDC) 2011 was promulgated by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt of India in early 2012. It was now mandatory for all recognised National Sports Federations to ensure compliance to the various provisions promulgated as part of the NSDC 2011. He stated that in 2013, the YAI Council had appointed a Committee to recommend amendments to the General Rules of the YAI so as to make them compliant to the NSDC 2011. The Committee had since submitted its report and the Council had approved the suggested alterations and amendments to the YAI General Rules. The HSG further informed the house that the Legal opinion was also obtained and inclusion of Bye-Laws had been suggested by the Legal team.
- 22. The HSG thereafter sought the approval of the General Body to initiate suitable actions for undertaking amendments to the YAI General Rules and incorporation of suitable Bye Laws so as to ensure compliance to NSDC 2011 and any other directions issued by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt of India, which had a direct impact on the functioning of the Association keeping in mind the general principles of good governance and Olympic movement.
- 23. Cmde Bunty Sethi LM 2140 appreciated the efforts made in this direction and stated that the amendments of YAI General Rules be a deliberate process to make them compliant to the NSDC 2011. Cdr Boyiri Varma concurred with Cmde Bunty Sethi and stated this would be a good step towards the general principles of good governance and Olympic movement.
- 24. Representative of NDA Sailing Club, Pune proposed amendments to the General Rules and formulation of Bye-Laws so as to make them compliant to the NSDC 2011. The proposal was seconded by the representative of National Hobie Class Association.

<u>Item No. VIII - Presentation of YAI Annual Awards for the year 2013 and 2014</u>

25. The HSG apprised the house that the Awards Committee headed by the Vice President met on 05 Dec 14 to scrutinise the nominations received for the YAI Annual Awards and approved the following awards for the year 2013 and 2014:-

- 27. Lt Gen KS Rao (Retd) LM 2098 requested if it was possible to reactivate the Annual Inter Club Regatta at national level with a view to increase participation in the sport.
- 28. The HSG requested member clubs and Class Associations to propose such an event and also stated that YAI would approve conduct of such events. He also informed the General Body that the Indian Navy had decided to conduct open championships at INA Ezhimala and Vishakhapatnam and requested maximum participation by yachtspersons.
- 29. The Chairman SPDC stated that the Clubs were welcome to have local Inter Club Regattas, however there would be only one National Championship for Seniors and Youth separately. The President directed to examine the proposal favorably once received from any club.

Item No. X - Vote of Thanks.

- 30. The Vice President, Lt Gen Rajiv Bhalla expressed his sincere gratitude to the President YAI for sparing his valuable time. He also thanked the President for casting a road map and vision for the YAI. The Vice President thanked other members of the Council and the General Body for coming to New Delhi to attend the meeting.
- 31. These minutes are issued with the approval of the President YAI.


